Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding Proposal 2022-2023



At Blue Gate Fields Junior School, we believe that sports and extra-curricular clubs play an important role in promoting social inclusion, healthy lifestyles and self-confidence. We aim to maintain the quality and quantity of sports and after-school clubs, inter and intra school competitions, as well as to increase opportunities for pupils to try different activities whilst raising participation numbers.

The Sports Grant funding was (April 2022 – August 2022) £8,104 based on a roll count of 245 pupils.

The DfE has announced that the grant will be available for the 2022-23 academic year, but has not published any allocation details or probable basis of calculation. Given that it has been fairly consistent over the years, we expect it to be somewhat similar to last year (around £18-19k for the full grant). However, if it bases the numbers on our roll number used for our main funding this year it will be 354 in which case it may be around £19.5k, so we anticipate around £11.3k will be made available to the school before March 2023 (the end of our financial year).

Through these events, pupils will be supported to develop healthy habits and the behaviours of fair play, positivity, respect and teamwork.		
Cross-curricular links will be made through maths sessions supported by physical activity, and led by our P.E. Teaching Assistant, with children taught in groups which address social and behavioural issues.

Our curriculum includes badminton, cricket, volleyball, goalball, dodgeball, tag rugby, cricket, basketball and boccia, and adventurous activities taught by our qualified P.E. staff and additional specialist instructors.	Shadwell Basin Outdoor Activity Centre hosts Year 6 pupils for outdoor adventurous activity, which will include bell boating, canoeing, climbing and high ropes activities. These activities expand the opportunities for physical activity, and encourage participation in sports beyond school based activities. The impact on confidence, resilience, team work and self-reliance impacts more widely on character and personal development. SEND pupils will attend Para games. Year 4 pupils will swim twice weekly for an intensive course. Gifted and talented pupils will continue to be identified and supported to make links at district level to clubs within the borough; they will be supported, if selected, to attend games, and training. Families to be made aware of sports opportunities that are available during school holiday times through text messaging and the school website in order to promote wider participation out of school hours.
